TACTICAL TIPS + TRICKS: General Tips 3: Knights vs Bishops Which Piece is Stronger?

Hi guys. I've seen lots of games that have come down to whose bishop or whose knight is better given the position? Without getting too technical, there are a few general rules that can help us work out if a knight or bishop is better. While both are worth 3 points, knights tend to like closed positions more (i.e. positions with lots of pieces still on the board) as they can jump over stuff. Bishops like open positions, (with not many pieces on the board) as they can move a lot faster than in an L shape. Having the so called "bishop pair"/the two bishops is usually always an advantage and this is actually the best minor piece pairing there is. That is, out of two bishops, two knights or knight and bishop. Remember, try to open the position if you have two bishops!

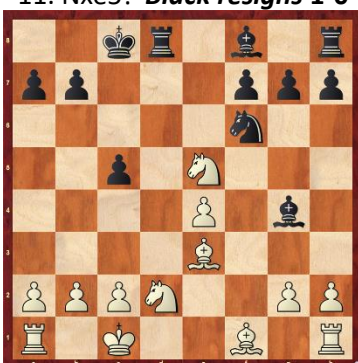
PESKY PUZZLES: In each position find the best move/moves. White to move = W Black to move = B
