Hi guys. For this second newsletter, I'm going to talk about the Lemur Gambit. That is again for White and happens after the moves 1. Pawn to d4, pawn to d5, 2. Pawn to f3 (aiming for pawn to e4) Knight to f6, 3. Pawn to e4, Black goes Pawn takes pawn 4. White replies f3 pawn takes Black's e4 Pawn, Black answers Knight takes e4 and now 5. White goes Knight to c3. In this gambit, White aims to develop quickly, and use the pressure along the open f file they have, to combine with a light squared Bishop on c4 and quick Queen development to the Black Kingside, in order to launch an attack. How this can work, is by swinging as many
