TACTICAL TIPS + TRICKS: Most Important "Drawing Rules" In Chess #4

Hi guys. Important to cover this especially with our checkmating patterns talk. As, if we're winning we want to win, if we're losing we might escape with a draw. There are Five (5) ways to draw a chessgame. These are, by **agreement**. By **stalemate**. Particularly useful relating to checkmate patterns, we need to make sure that our opponent always has one legal move they can make on the board until we checkmate them. If they can't move and they're not attacked it's a draw. **Threefold repetition**. If the same position appears on the board 3 times that's a draw. **50 move rule**. If 50 moves have been made without a capture or pawn move a player can claim a draw. **No checkmating material**. If it's impossible to checkmate, example King + bishop vs. King.
