TACTICAL TIPS + TRICKS: Most Important: Checkmate Patterns Appear In All Parts of the Game #5

Hi everyone. This term we've looked at some common checkmating patterns that happen in the endgame. These patterns all occur when your opponent only has their King left. We looked at King and Queen, Two Rooks, + King and Rook mate. However, different checkmating patterns/combinations can happen at any part of the chess game. From the classic Legal's mate with knights and bishops, to Anastasia's mate with knight and rook, to Boden's mate with two bishops, to Philidor's mate where our opponent's king is blocked in by its own pieces. Now there are many more checkmating patterns that you can learn, but the key with all of them is to be aware of them as they could come up in your games. We might go through some more in future RNFs:)
