
TACTICAL TIPS + TRICKS: Opening General Ideas: Trying Out opening "Gambits" #5

Hi everyone, for this RNF, I thought we'd look at a group of openings called "gambits". A gambit is where one side gets even faster development and more control over the centre than the opponent. How that side achieves this, is by giving up/gambiting (hopefully temporarily) usually a pawn. If the side playing the Gambit can get their pawn back, then they have a much better position. A common gambit opening is the Queen's Gambit which happens after the moves- d4 d5 c4! White doesn't protect their c pawn but if black accepts the gambit and plays pawn takes c4, white answers with pawn e4, getting a huge pawn centre and immediately attacking the c4 pawn with their f1 bishop. It's quite tricky for black to hang onto this extra pawn in practice.


