Hi everyone. For this RNF I thought we'd look at my favourite player of all time, the holder of the World Chess Champion title for the longest time ever, the great German chess player Emanuel Lasker (1868-1941). Lasker himself was World Champion from 1894 to 1921. Naturally, Lasker is regarded as one of the strongest players ever in history as a result. But what made him so strong? And what lessons can we importantly take from his play? It's interesting. You could almost say Lasker was more or less by himself in a lot of his chess strategies. That is, as opposed to his fellow players of the time. Lasker believed in playing the "most practical" moves a lot. Not solely the "best moves". This meant that often Lasker would play moves that would put his opponents




