"Tactical Trickery" **Exchange Sacrifices**

Do practice the ideas:)

Hi everyone. In this newsletter I thought I'd cover a pretty tricky idea known as an 'exchange sacrifice'. Now, an exchange is the difference between a Rook and a Bishop or Knight. A Rook is basically one level higher up of pieces... Chess masters often give up a Rook for an opponent's Knight or Bishop (and hopefully a pawn as well). When they do this they are losing on points. So, you might ask, why would they want to be losing on points in the first place? Masters typically perform an exchange sacrifice to open up an opponent's castled King. Masters typically perform an exchange sacrifice to secure a dangerous passed pawn- one that's close to Queening. Or, masters perform an exchange sacrifice to permanently install a strong Bishop or Knight in the centre. In
