SEE MAGIC MINI FOR **MY GAME**

Hi guys. For this newsletter, I thought I'd talk about a normal standard, solid opening, played by lots of Grandmasters, but I myself have only ever played it twice. This is not a knock on the opening for Black- (which is called the Slav defence), at all, it's just all chess players have openings/ways to start a game, that suit their own style. And we learn what we like and don't like (called an opening repertoire) from experience. But in keeping with the rare openings theme this term, I thought I'd share lessons from playing the Slav myself. The Slav defence is for Black and happens after the moves, 1. White pawn to d4, Black answers pawn to d5. Now 2. White tries the Queens Gambit with pawn to c4, and Black replies pawn to c6. This is the Slav. The idea is to develop
