Hi guys. Another interesting idea in chess (one that's kind of off the main pathway again) is to skip the middlegame altogether and go straight from the opening part of the game into the endgame. That is, to do a Queen trade out of the opening in the very early moves of the game! I know previous RNFs have kind of touched upon this, but I wanted to specifically focus in this newsletter on some of the reasons for doing such. After for examples moves like 1. e4 d6 2. d4 Nf6 3. Nc3 and now e5!? Black is immediately offering a Queen trade to White. If White plays pawn takes pawn, and Black recaptures, White can now go Queen takes Queen and Black will go King takes Queen. Sure, Black can no longer castle, but when the Queens are off you don't necessarily need to!
