TACTICAL TIPS + TRICKS:

Hi everyone. One thing that makes it really easy to attack in chess (and everyone likes to attack of course ③), but one thing that makes it easy is to place our pieces in so called "holes" or weak squares. A hole/weak square in chess is any square on the board that can't be guarded by a pawn. Now, if a pawn attacks any piece it will have to run away. By placing pieces in holes, this ensures they can't be easily chased away anytime soon. And, we can therefore use holes as jumping off points from which to launch our attack. Think about it. Especially centre squares, but also squares close to the opponents King, if we occupy such squares with our pieces and our pieces can't be dislodged, this can be a very big advantage in the overall big picture of the game.
