TACTICAL TIPS + TRICKS: <u>Positional lucas in Circus in C</u>

Hi guys. I think this tip applies to a lot of different things- not just chess. But why I included it under "positional ideas in chess", is one way to know more than your opponent (especially at the start of the game in the opening), is to play a universal opening that you can always get out. That is, openings we've spoken about in previous RNFs, like the Larsen Attack (rnfs 21-25) or the Black Lion (rnfs 41-45), are openings that will give you a good position. More than that, if you know the plans behind them, you can start the game with a reasonable amount of confidence that you'll get exactly the type of middle game positions that you're after. Of course, you don't have to play these openings- (there's many like them), but learning something you can always get out
